During this year's meeting we honored Ms. Judy Coppedge who donated \$5,000 in honor of her late husband and our previous DOM, Bro. Joe Coppedge. With that donation, the *Joe Coppedge Memorial Scholarship Fund* was established. This way, no child will ever be turned away from camp because of finances. We also honored Dr. Bob Kitchen and Bro. Bob Brown for all their work in the Disaster Relief Ministry. Their leadership in the past has played a great part in where we are today.

Another Disaster Relief opportunity which we acted upon was a partnership agreement between SBU's Colligate Disaster Relief Ministry and our Disaster Relief Ministry. A formal agreement was made for us to work together, and to share equipment and personnel. I am excited about being able to work together.

Our Annual Meeting theme was **Iron Sharpens Iron**, taken from **Proverbs 27:17**, "As iron sharpens iron, so a man sharpens the countenance of his friend." The purpose of this theme was to remind us that we need each other. This year's Annual Meeting was about drawing closer together as an association. Six pastors, along with the AMS, brought seven individual 15 minute messages designed to create one big message. 
